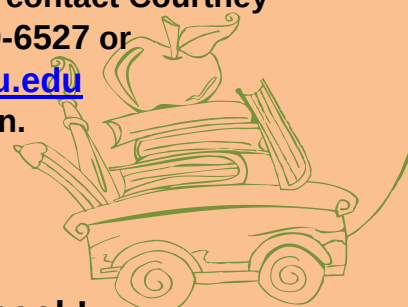

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WATCHING THEM GROW: RESOURCES FOR TEACHERS & PARENTS

While high quality early education is rooted in the belief that each child develops at his or her own individual pace, research shows that there are predictable milestones along this continuum.

Early childhood professionals often need a reliable developmental checklist to assess the youngsters in their care and to share with parents and other family members. Below are several reliable resources that can be accessed online. These materials can be printed out or viewed electronically.

Centers for Disease Control & Prevention (CDC) provides developmental milestones for children from two months to five years. There are also short video clips that can be watched online. <https://www.cdc.gov/ncbddd/actearly/milestones/index.html>

With help from the American Academy of Pediatrics, **Child Mind Institute** has created a Parents Guide to Developmental Milestones for newborns through five years. <https://childmind.org/guide/developmental-milestones/>
